



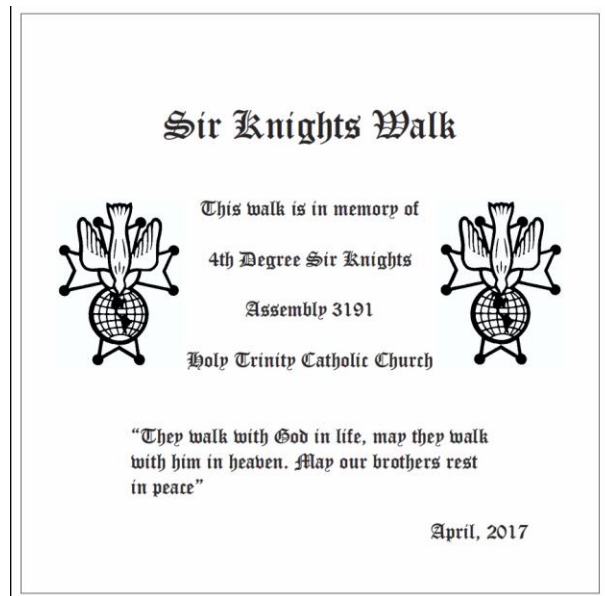

Major progress was made this month in bringing to fruition Sir Knights Walk, a memorial to deceased Sir Knights of our Assembly. The design of the headstone which is incorporated in the memorial was finalized.



Production of the headstone will take approximately four weeks with the installation of the Memorial to follow shortly. The Assembly's fund raising for the Memorial is a success and demonstrates the generosity of our members as well as their enthusiastic commitment to this endeavor.

A major change to the Last Rites policy was approved by the membership. A Resolution of Policy supplementing Assembly By-laws was passed:

“Upon the death of any member of this Assembly who is in good standing, his name will be inscribed in the Assembly’s Memorial of deceased members, known as Sir Knight’s Walk. Additionally, in memory of the deceased Sir Knight, the Assembly will contribute to a charity whose values are in harmony with those of the Knights of Columbus.

All members who filed a Last Rights Form prior to the approval of this motion may continue their request for a Chalice or other Religious Memorial in accordance with Assembly By-laws.

On Good Friday, a well-attended turnout of 22 Sir Knights was held at Holy Trinity for the Passion of Christ and Veneration of the Cross. A turnout of Sir Knights was held on April 23rd for Divine Mercy Sunday and the Color Corps escorted the Relic of St. Faustina into the sanctuary and to its permanent reliquary in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. The Assembly Color Corps participated in the first of two Confirmations being conducted at Holy Trinity. The first Confirmation was held Friday, April 28 and was presided by Bishop Pfeiffer from San Angelo. Color Corps Commander Tom Trbovich led the Sir Knights as the Bishop and confirmation candidates were escorted into the sanctuary



There will be a Turnout for the next Confirmation on Friday, May 19. Our new Auxiliary Bishop Boulette will preside.
